

# Mrs. Boyer Will Seek Seat On School Board

Mrs. Clarine Boyer, of 500E Charles St., today announced her candidacy for a seat on the Easton Area School Board under the recently-approved re-districting plan.

Mrs. Boyer, a Democrat, will run for one of two vacancies on the board from Region II which includes Riegelsville, Easton's South Side, and Easton Wards one, two, three, four and five.

There will be three vacancies to be filled this year. The third will be from Region I, including Palmer Township and Easton's Eighth Ward, Western District.

Announcing her candidacy, Mrs. Boyer said: "I feel I could do a good job because I am interested in a good, thorough education for all the kids in the system."

## Negro History

If elected, Mrs. Boyer promised to implement Negro history courses from grade schools through the high school.

The candidate said had she been on the board during the recent disorders at Easton Area High School, "I would have tried to sit down and reason with the students."

She said the school administration and educational officials have "consistently refused to communicate seriously with the students."

## 'Bad Policy'

"The administration maintains that the teacher is always

right, that under no circumstances can the teacher be wrong. I think this is a bad policy," she said.

Mrs. Boyer asserted that in the "recent crisis some of the strict disciplinary procedures should have been relaxed."

"The current educational program is too much geared toward discipline. I'm more interested in education than discipline," she said.

## 25-Year Resident

Mrs. Boyer, an Easton resident for the past 25 years, is married to Marvin Boyer.

She has five children, two presently in the Easton Area school system. She is on leave from Western Electric Co., Allentown.

Her volunteer activities include being a Girl Scout leader, a member of the executive board of the Easton NAACP, a member of St. Joseph's Catholic Church, secretary of the Delaware Terrace Improvement Association, and secretary of Parents and Interested Citizens (PIC).
